
このロゴは、視覚でがれる詩のような存在です。中央には、優でとしたのシンボルがかれており、日本文化において深い象性を持ちます。

語りがれる物語のように、このロゴもまた、静かに、そして深く印象を残します。


Logo Concept



Haruki Murakami


Haruki Murakami is one of the most influential voices in contemporary literature. Born in Kyoto in 1949, his work drifts between the surreal and the deeply human—where jazz plays in the background, cats vanish, and loneliness lingers like fog. With novels like Norwegian Wood, Kafka on the Shore, and The Wind-Up Bird Chronicle, Murakami crafts worlds that feel both distant and intimately familiar. His writing is spare yet haunting, often exploring memory, time, identity, and the spaces between. In bridging Japanese subtlety with global sensibility, Murakami doesn't just tell stories—he builds dreamscapes that stay with you long after the page is turned.










Fyodor Dostoevsky






